PROP 65 STATEMENT

Dear Valued Customer,

The following is in response to your request for information on the compliance of Kirk Key Interlock's products with California's Proposition 65, also known as "Safe drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986. The statements are based on the most recent list of "CHEMICALS KNOWN TO THE STATE TO CAUSE CANCER OR REPRODUCTIVE TOXICITY" issued January 3rd, 2020.

Regarding uncoated products supplied by the Kirk Key Interlock Company:

- None of the Prop 65 listed chemicals are used in the manufacture of Kirk Key Interlocks products.
- None of the Prop 65 listed chemicals are present as by-products.
- Prop 65 listed chemical that may be present as impurities in the stainless steel components of our products is Nickel. This listed impurity is contained within the metals matrix and would not be expected to cause exceedance of the Labor Code (LC) as provided to customer.
- Prop 65 listed chemicals that may be present as trace impurities such as Cadmium (<0.001%), and Lead (<0.001%). These three listed trace impurities are contained within the metals matrix and would not be expected to cause exceedance of the No Significant Risk Levels (NSRLs) for Carcinogens or Maximum Allowable Dose Levels (MADLs) for Chemicals Causing Reproductive Toxicity.

Please note that this response is for informational purposes only and that Kirk Key Interlock is not accepting responsibility for compliance of your customer's parts or assemblies with the State of California's Proposition 65 regulation.
